

**Title:** Finding Your Passion

**Key Verses:** Matthew 4:18–20; John 1:14; Ephesians 2:10; Philippians 2:5–11

**Summary:** Divine purpose is discovered by doing something and sticking to it.



**Power Up:** Take a moment to prepare

Our world is filled with talk about self-discovery and pursuit of your passion. Describe where you have seen this message communicated.



**Replay:** Take some time to watch

Note the flow of Hannah's talk: **1)** God sees potential in young leaders; **2)** God wants to use us to change the world; **3)** "discovering" vs. "crafting" your passion; **4)** three steps to craft your passion; **5)** your unique role.



**Comment:** Take some time to talk

**Read Matthew 4:18-20.** *What does this show us about Jesus's view of us? What qualifications did Peter and Andrew have?*


*What doubts do you have about your qualifications to lead? What should change in your life knowing Jesus sees you as a leader?*

*Which of the steps to crafting passion is most difficult for you? Why?*

Hannah warns against the "magical moment" mentality in discovering purpose. *What does this mean? What's a better way to find purpose?*

*What wrong in the world do you feel compelled make right? How do you think God wants to use you to make that wrong right?*

**Read Philippians 2:6-8.** *What heroic example does Jesus set for us? What is the problem when we try to be the hero of our own story?*



**Pause:** Take a moment to pray

Thank Jesus for seeing potential in us to make an impact in the world. Thank Him for modeling a life of purpose and sacrifice. Ask Him for clarity on what to do to make a difference. Ask Him for strength to stick with it.



**Take Action:** Take a step forward

Look in the mirror. The image reflected shows a leader. God made you to make a difference. Now find a place or cause to get your hands dirty: volunteering at church, advocating, raising money, tutoring, etc. Let someone else know what you plan to do, so they can ask you about it.

### 3 Steps to Discover Our Purpose

#### 1. ***Just Do Something***

“We have to take ownership. We have to craft [our purpose] ourselves.

When we buy the “discover your passion” message proliferating in our world, it puts the purpose outside of us. It takes the ownership off of us. We’re stuck waiting for this magical moment that is never going to come.

“It’s in the *doing* that God reveals our purpose to us... [Doing] gives God the opportunity to tap us on the shoulder and say, ‘Hey, that’s [your passion].’”

**Things To Do:** Volunteering at church. Caring for homeless. Go to nursing home. Run a race to raise money for a cause. Advocating for poor, oppressed. Volunteering with special needs.

#### 2. ***Keep Doing Something***

“There is something that brings impact into the world. It’s not glamorous, cool, fun. It’s sustained passion, consistency, showing up day after day after day.”

“The only way we’ll ever see lasting impact with our lives is to stay committed.”

#### 3. ***Refuse to Become the Hero***

“If we are the heroes of our own story, then we get to engage in our purpose only when it makes us look good.”

“No one has ever contested the hero mentality like Jesus did.”

“If we live out our purpose, it’s always centered on others. Every time.”

“Jesus didn’t create us to be the hero. He created us to be agents of love in our world.”
