Introduction to 1 Corinthians

Who wrote it?

Who was it written to? People in the church in Corinthian

According to Greek legend, Sisyphus was a king of Corinth. For defying the gods with his insolent wit he was sentenced to the eternal drudgery of pushing a huge stone up a hill. When he would reach the summit, the stone would roll back to the bottom and force resumption of the task.

- -Like sisyphus, the people of Corinth had issues with pride and with many sinful behaviors
- -Pride and worldly pleasure will in the end lead you to a dead end
- -Paul in this book shows us a better way

1 Corinthians 1 and 2

What problem does Paul address is this chapter?

- 1 Corinthians 1:12-13
- -they have formed their little groups around their favorite teacher and they are fighting with each other
- -not wrong to have a favorite teacher
- -the issue is pridefully saying my way and my teacher is better than you
- -totally wrong for two reasons
- 1) it's not about man's wisdom, it's about God's wisdom
- 2) all these teachers are on the same team trying to help people know Jesus better
- *if they are teaching the Bible and helping people know Jesus, then we're all on the same team
- -this is why we partner with other churches in the community at times
- *forming cliches based on social status or interest
- -if they are seeking to follow the Jesus and the Bible, then we need to care for them and seek to encourage them. They are our brother and sister in Jesus
