## Mark 11:20-25

Does this passage teach we can pray for whatever we want and get it?

-we can't draw a theology or belief system from one verse

What do we have to believe without doubting?

- 1) that God is able to do what we ask
- -the context is the disciples are stunned that Jesus made the tree die
- -after all they saw how are they stunned he killed a tree
- -Jesus main point is having the faith that God can do anything
- \*The point is not that God will fulfill our every wim but that he can do anything
- \*\*This is especially important when we don't get what we asked for
- 2) we need to line ourselves up with God's will
- -If we look at Jesus other teachings on prayer he is pretty clear that we need to ask according to God's will, not just ours
- -There are other passages that promise God will answer our prayers and there is always a condition
- -John 14:13-14, John 15:7, 1 John 5:14-15
- -We must be on the same page as God and asking according to his will
- -Ultimately it is God's will that is most important because he knows what's best in each circumstance
- -Our requests can fall into one of three categories
- 1) We know it not God's will
- 2) We know it is God's will
- 3) We're not sure whether it is God's will
- -We should obviously not pray for the first
- -We can have great confidence in praying for the second
- -We ask bolding about the third with the understanding that we want to submit to the will of God (Mark 14:36)
- -Ultimately prayer is about us submitting ourselves to the plan of God and finding comfort in that
- -It's not about us convincing God to do what we want
